Other New Federal Funds

American Rescue Plan Act (enacted March 11)

- ERAP 2 \$21.55 billion expansion
- HOME \$5 billion (includes capital funding!)
- Housing Choice Vouchers \$5 billion
- LIHEAP (\$4.5 billion) and Water Assistance (\$500 million)
- Homeowner Assistance \$9.96 billion

HOME, Voucher resources generally limited to households who:

- (1) are or are at risk of experiencing homelessness
- (2) are fleeing or attempting to flee domestic violence, dating violence, stalking, sexual assault, or human trafficking, or
- (3) are recently homeless and assistance will prevent the family's homelessness or having a high risk of housing instability

CDC Guidance – May 14

- Most fully vaccinated people with no COVID-like symptoms do not need to quarantine, be restricted from work, or be tested following an exposure to someone with suspected or confirmed COVID-19, as their risk of infection is low. However, they should still monitor for symptoms of COVID-19 for 14 days following an exposure. Exceptions where testing (but not quarantine) is still recommended following an exposure to someone with suspected or confirmed COVID-19 include: Fully vaccinated residents and employees of correctional and detention facilities and homeless shelters.
- Risk of SARS-CoV-2 infection is minimal for fully vaccinated people. The risk of SARS-CoV-2 transmission from fully vaccinated people to unvaccinated people is also reduced.
 Therefore, fully vaccinated people can resume activities without wearing a mask or physically distancing, except where required by federal, state, local, tribal, or territorial laws, rules, and regulations, including local business and workplace guidance. Fully vaccinated people should also continue to wear a well-fitted mask in correctional facilities and homeless shelters. Prevention measures are still recommended for unvaccinated people.

Harford Co CoC Interest

- April 2021: Harford County CoC expressed interest in learning about joining the Balance of State
- April May 2021: Preliminary meetings have been held with the Harford County CoC Board, the BoS Executive Committee, Lead Agency, TA Providers and HUD
- Next Steps:
 - DHCD has provided a proposed merge timeline for Harford to review
 - The Harford Co CoC Board will need an official vote to merge with the BoS
 - The BoS Board will vote to approve the merge
 - DHCD will begin the process with HUD
