The BoS will work to convene the Committee after the SFY2025 HSP process complete!

CoC Board approved an ad-hoc committee to develop tools, guidance and processes for LHCs to use for HSP funding application process.

- The committee will meet twice to review, edit and approve proposed tools
- The committee will present recommendations and tools to the board for approval/adoption
- Committee membership will require at least one member from each Local Lead Agency

Examples of possible work items:

- Develop guidelines for local LHC committees in overseeing the project selection process
- Develop shared communication standards for grantees/subgrantees
- Develop sample scoring tools LHCs could use to evaluate program design and performance
- Develop written standards for HSP

- Will provide system recommendations / upgrades upon completion

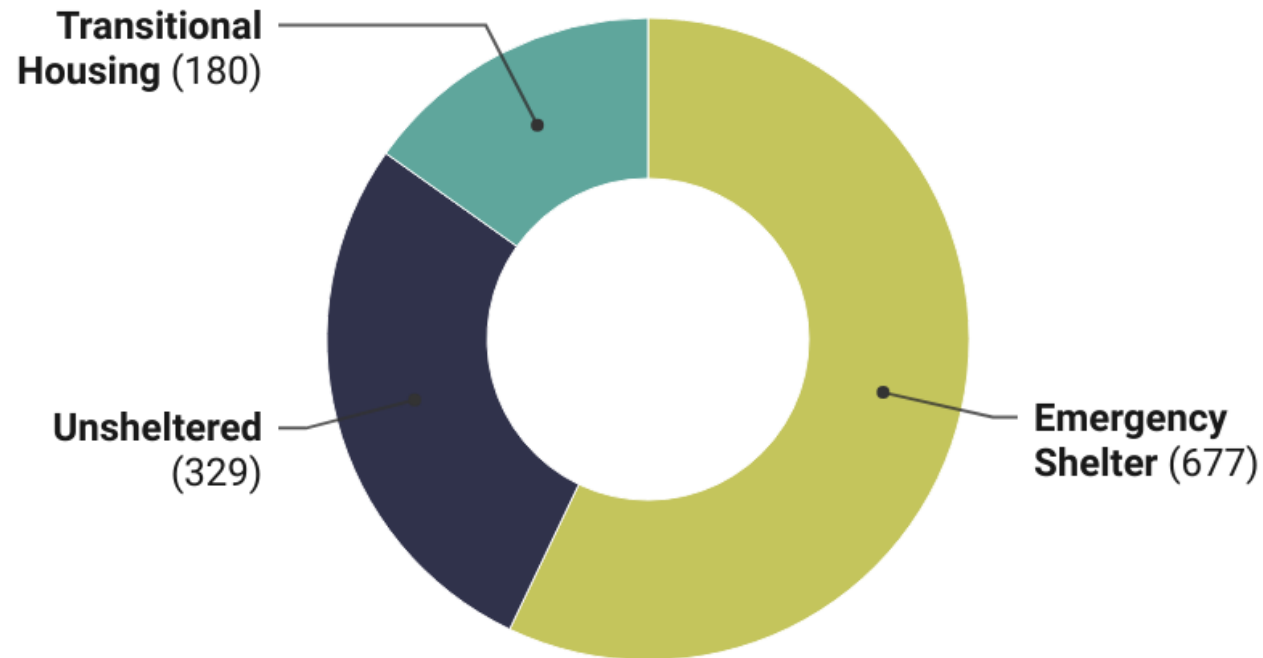
ICA will take over as the full time HMIS System Administrators July 1st

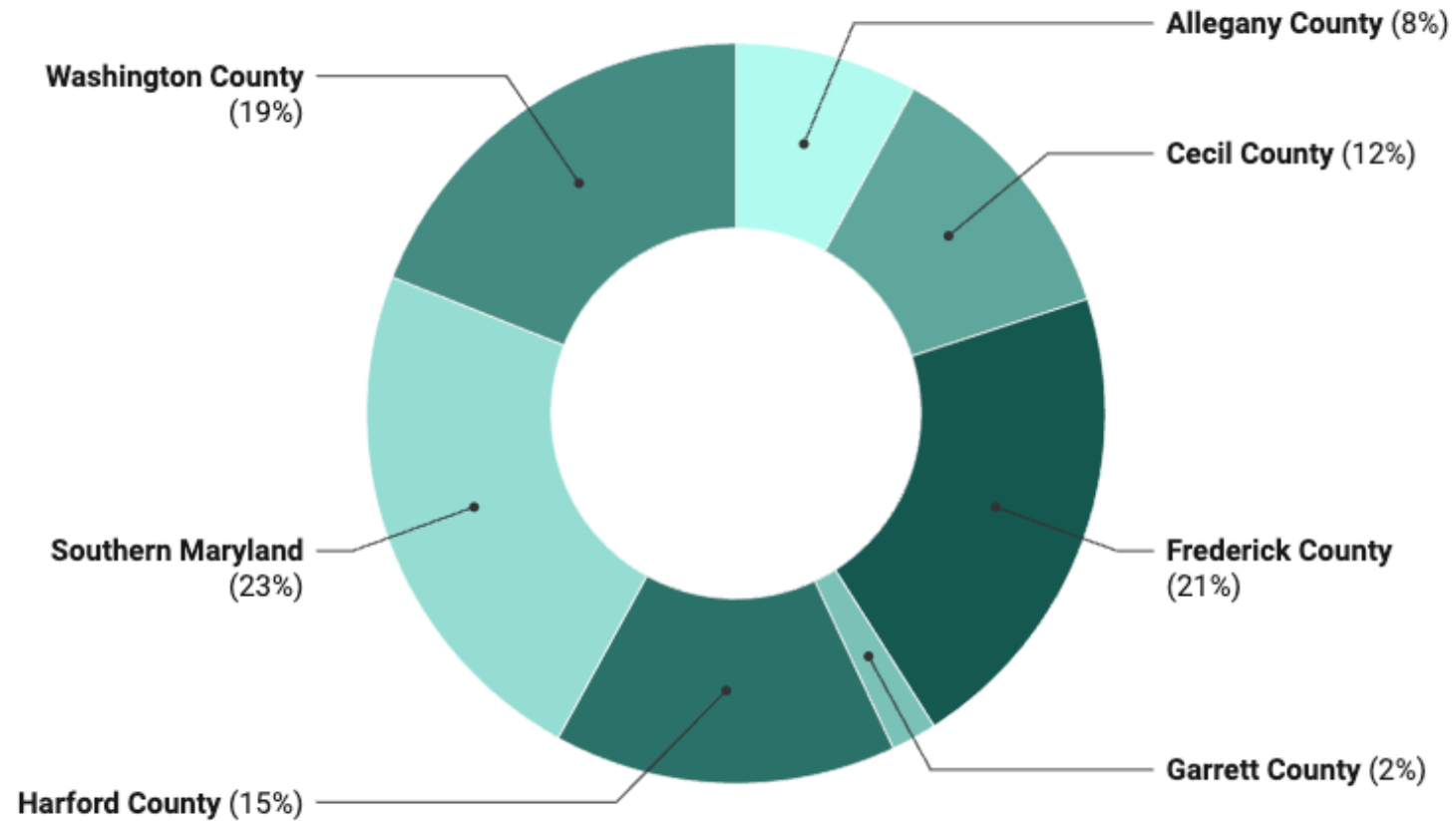
2024 MD BoS PIT Count

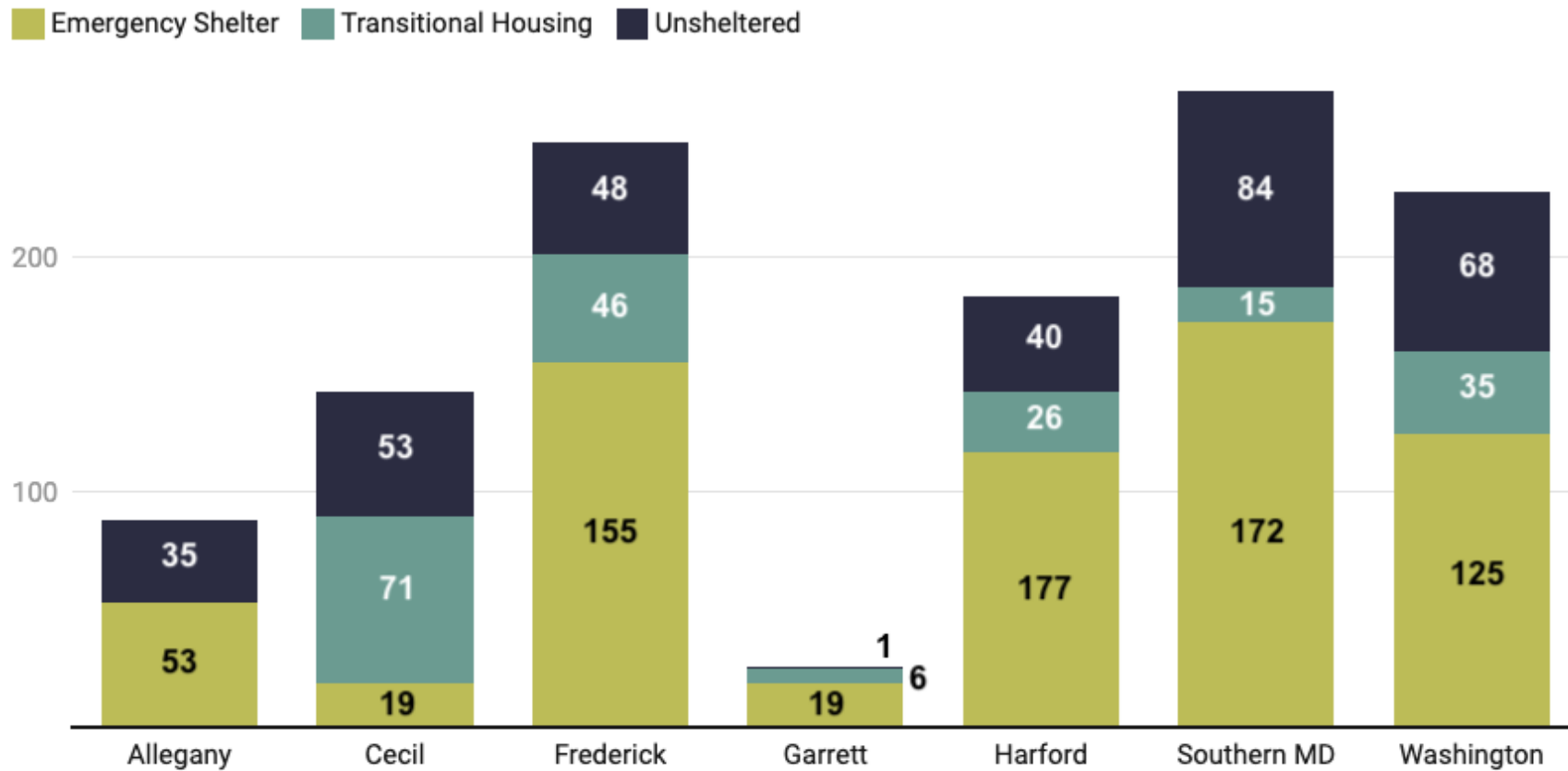

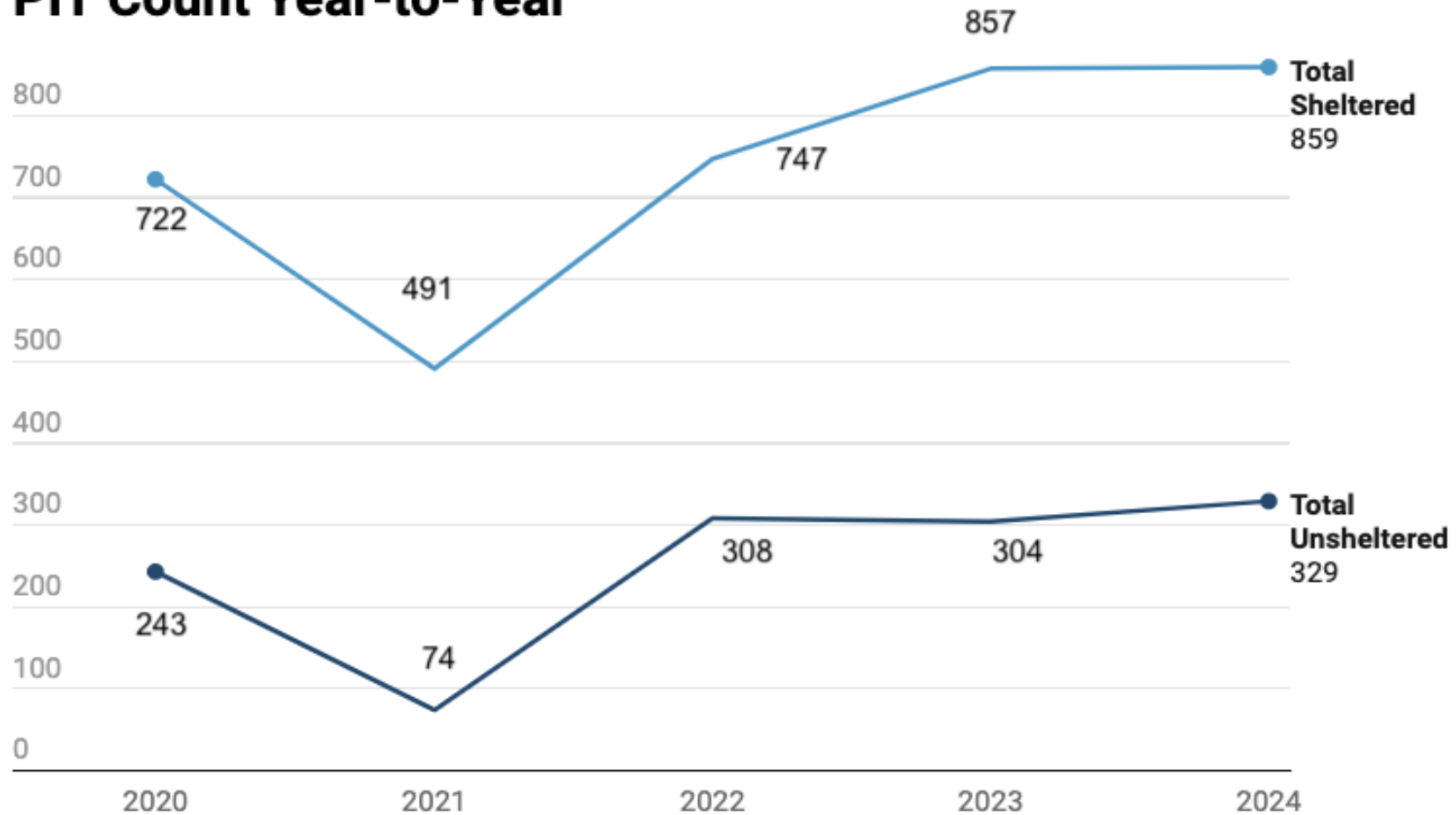

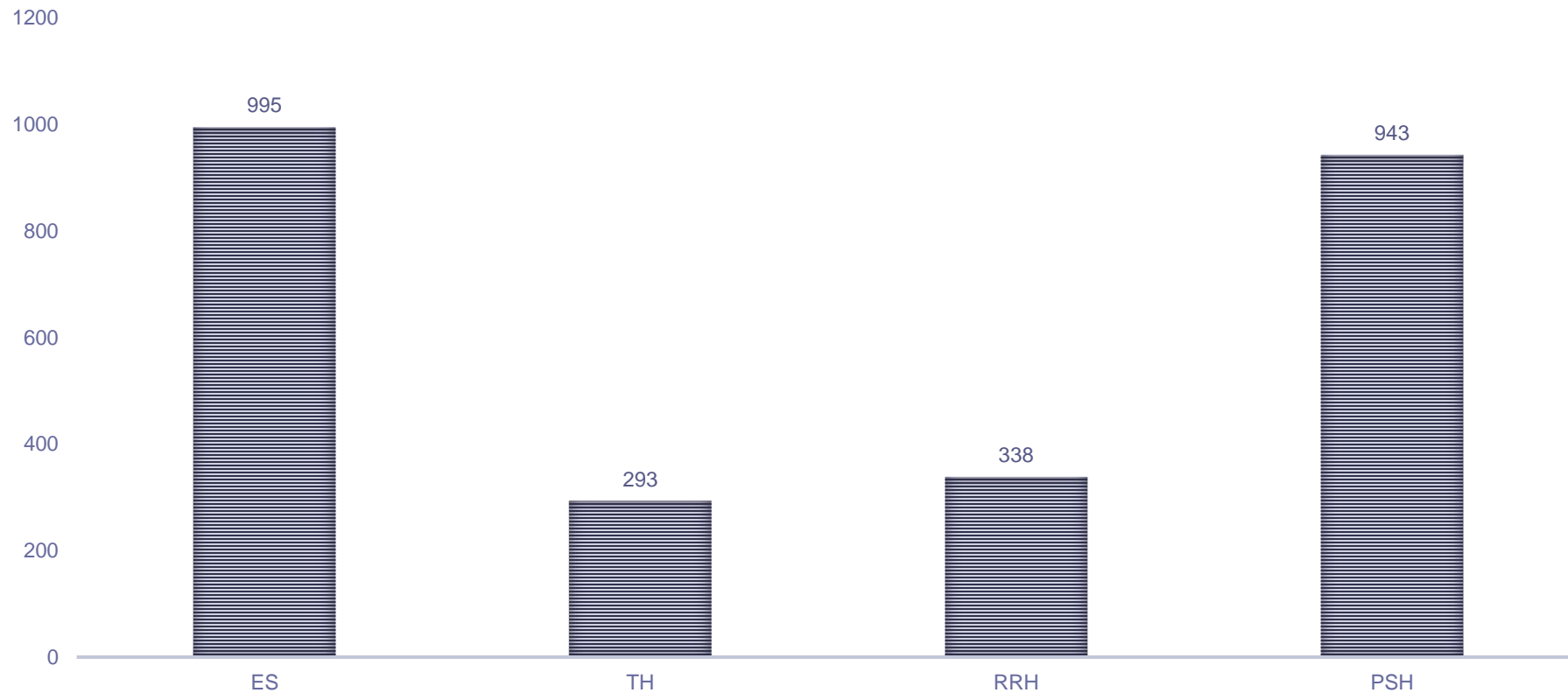

PIT Count Year-to-Year



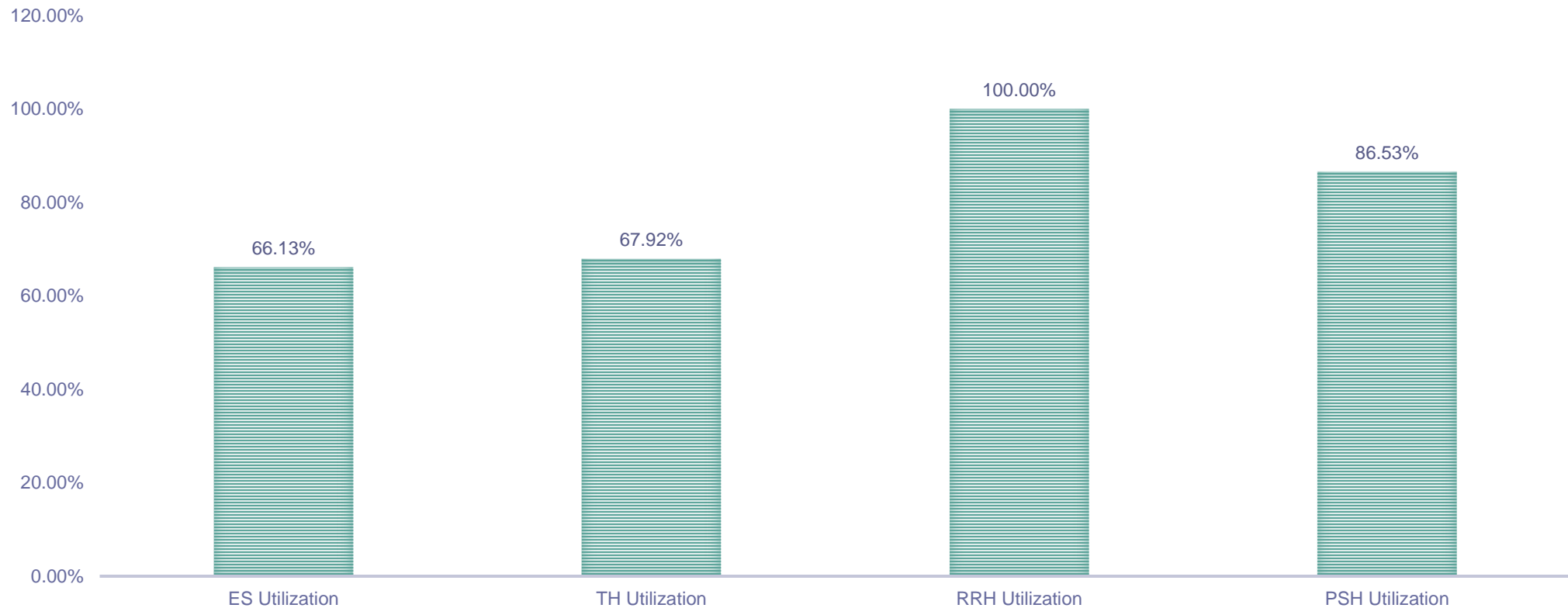

2024 HOUSING INVENTORY COUNT TOTAL BEDS



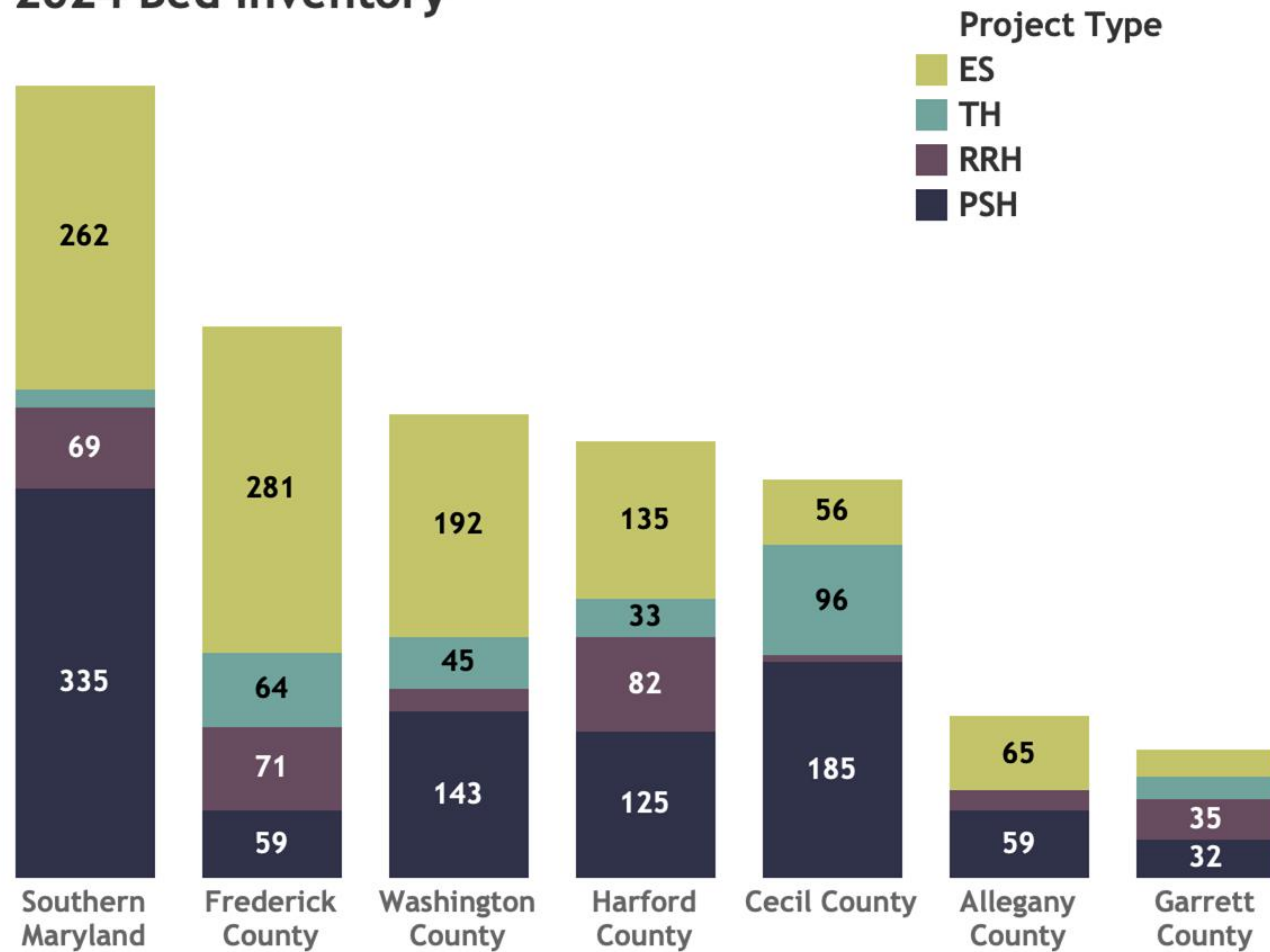

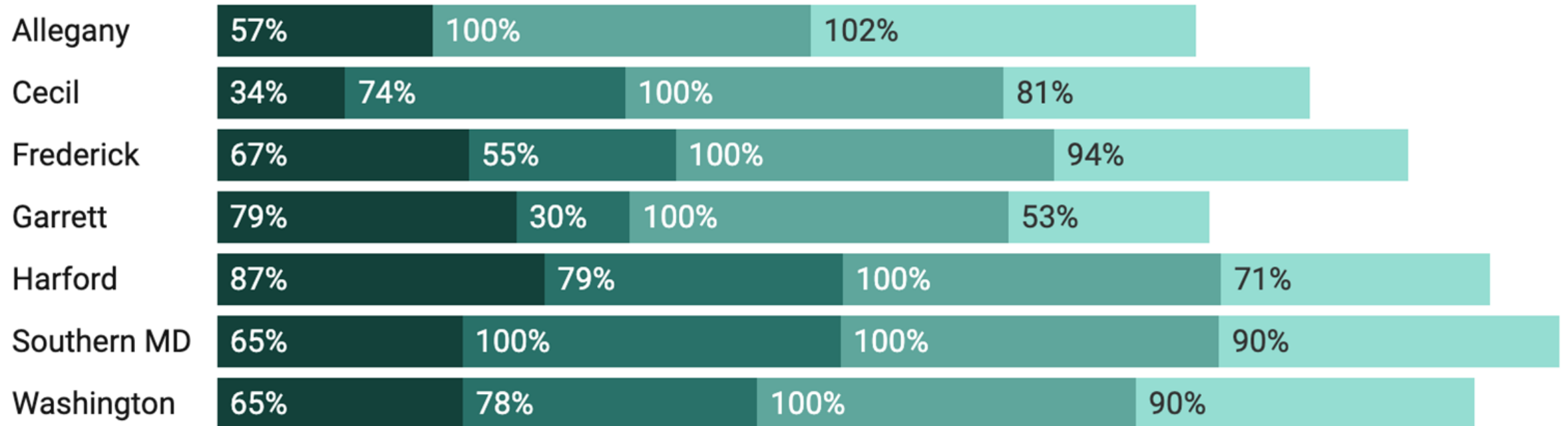

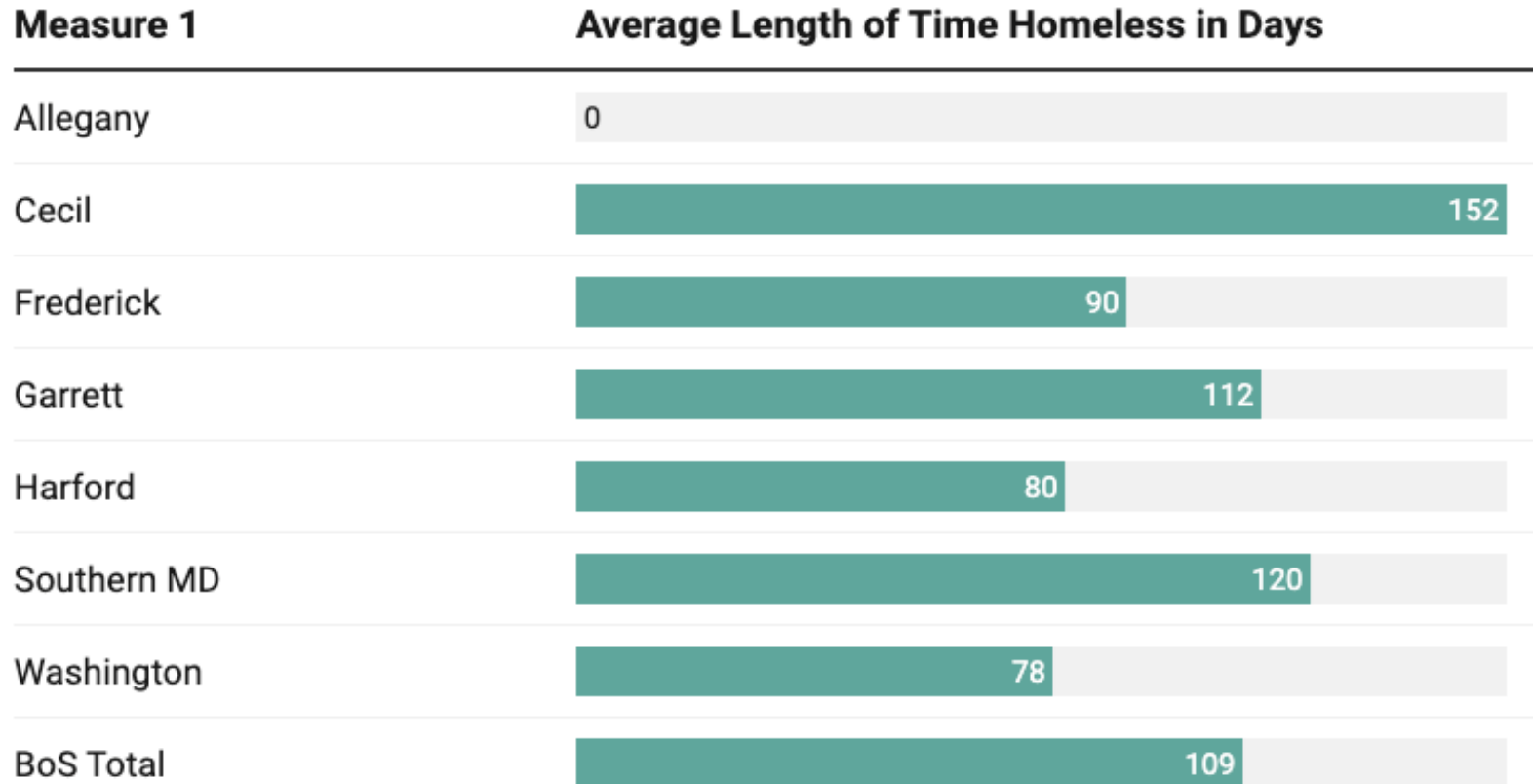


Measure 1: Length of Time Persons Remain Homeless

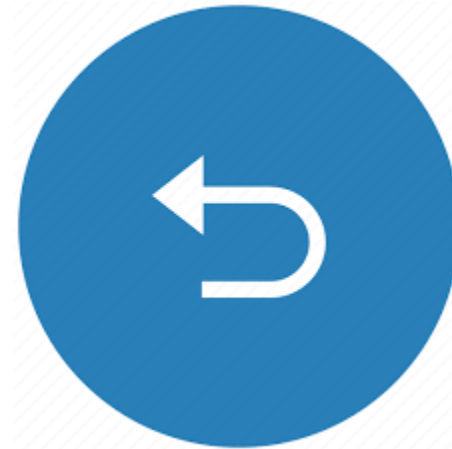

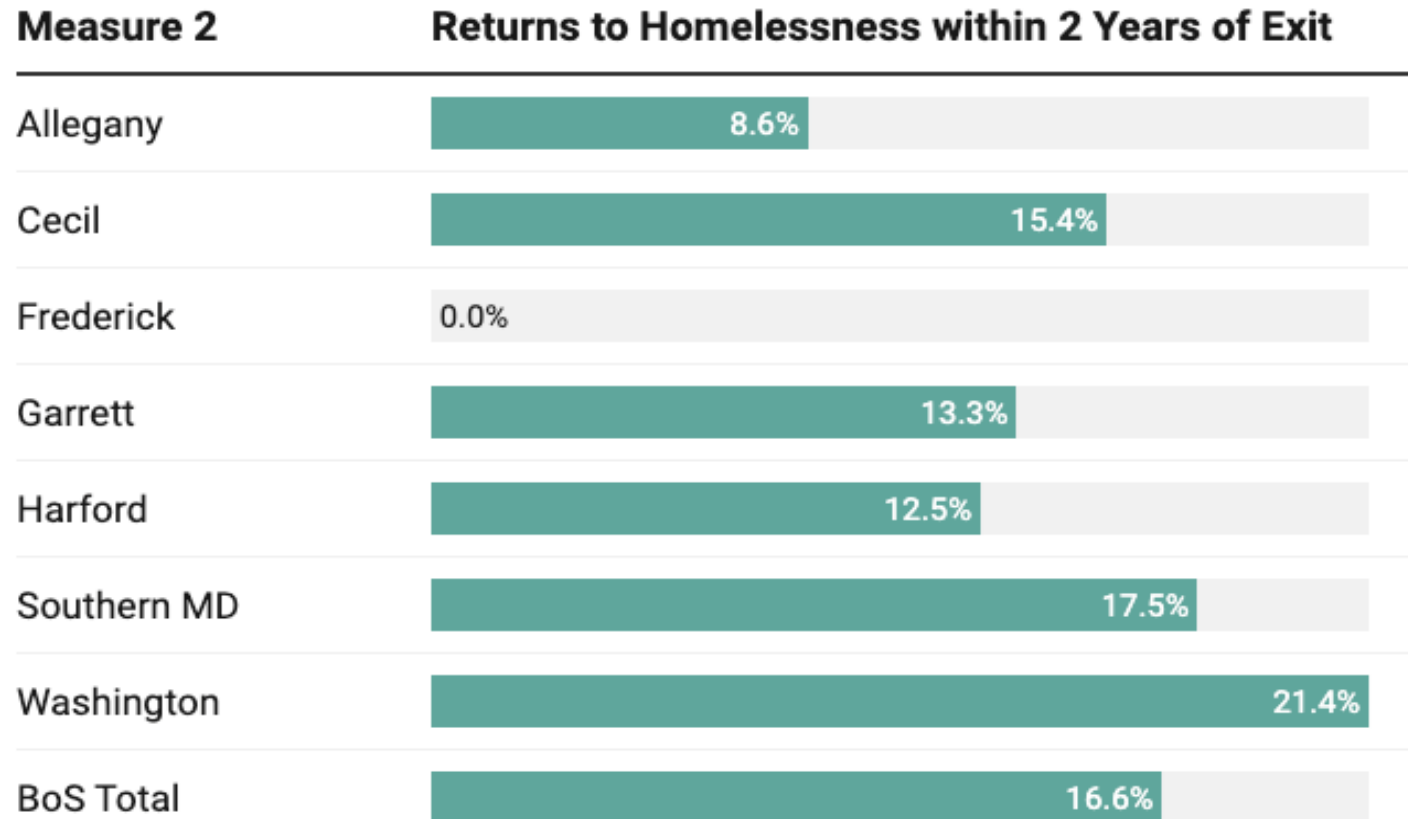

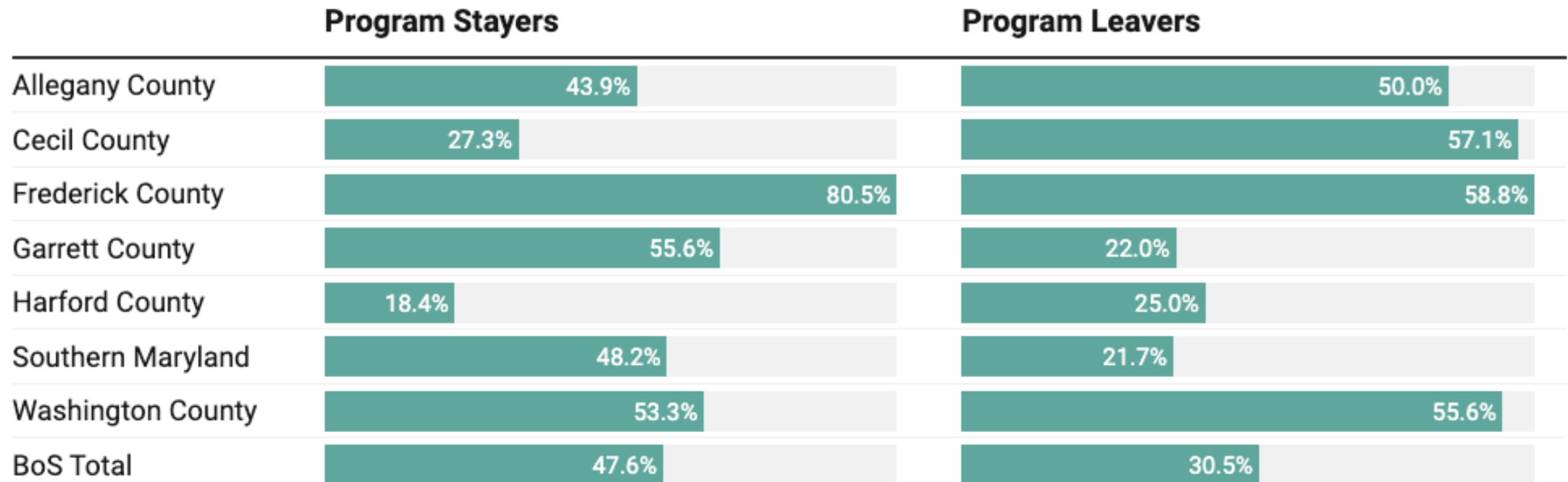

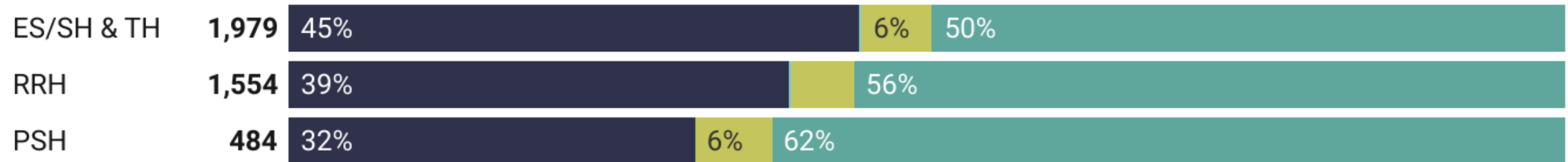
CoC Coalition Building: Racial & Social Equity Workshop

- Purpose is to assist CoCs to develop and implement any efforts with thoughtful consideration; one on one technical assistance; peer sharing opportunities and guided toolkits

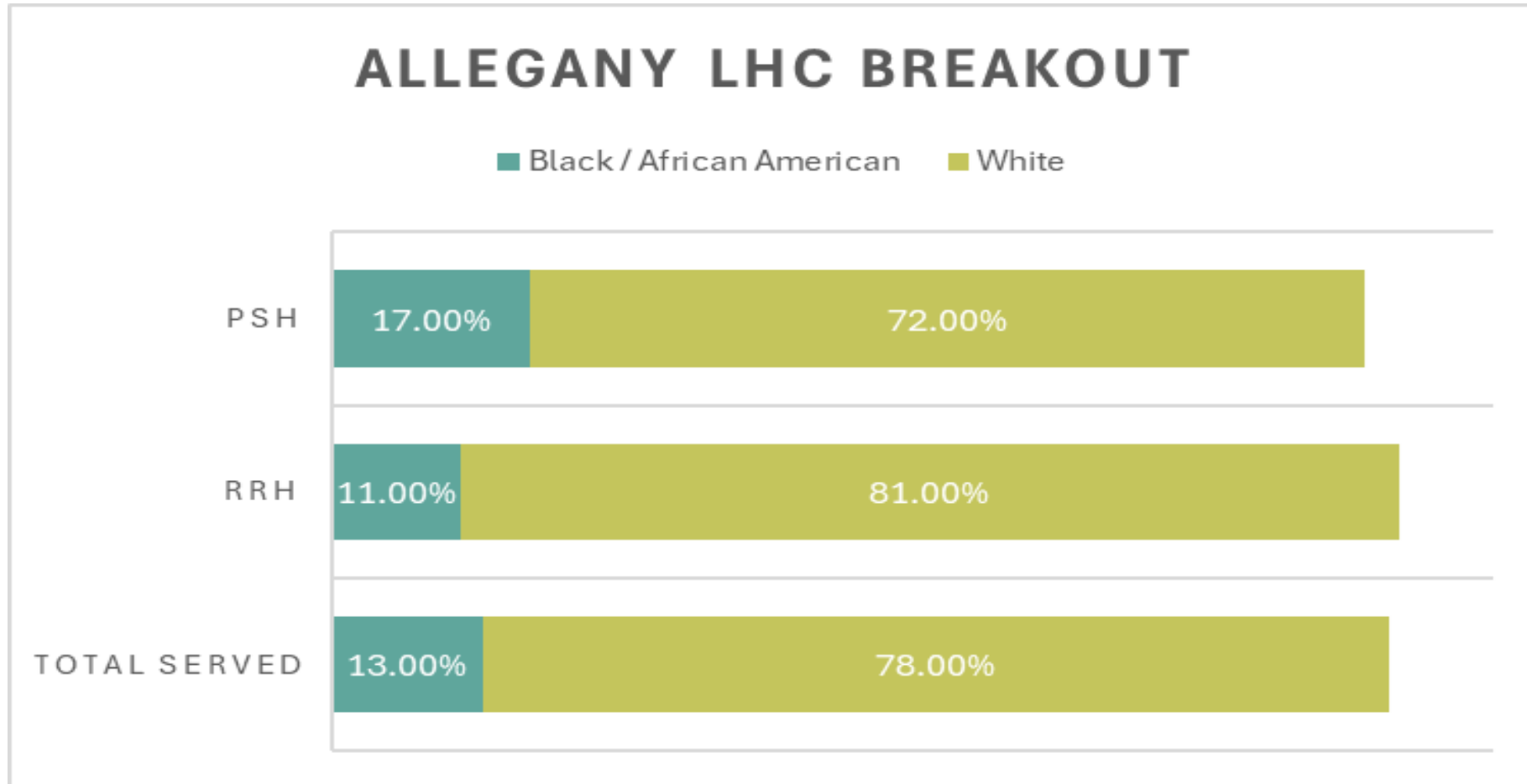

Demographics Served by Project Type (Percentages)

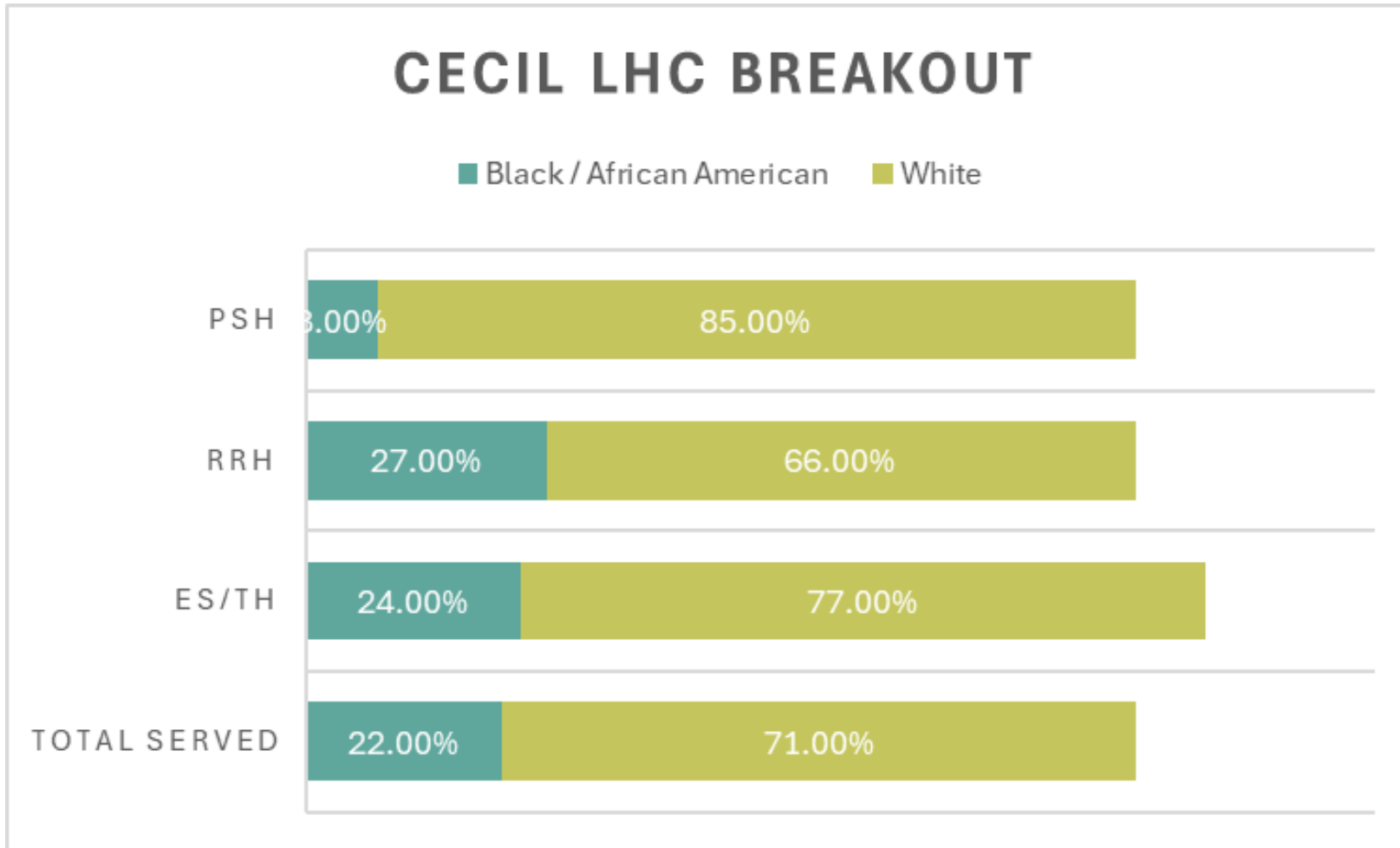
Black Hispanic/Latina/o Multiple Races White



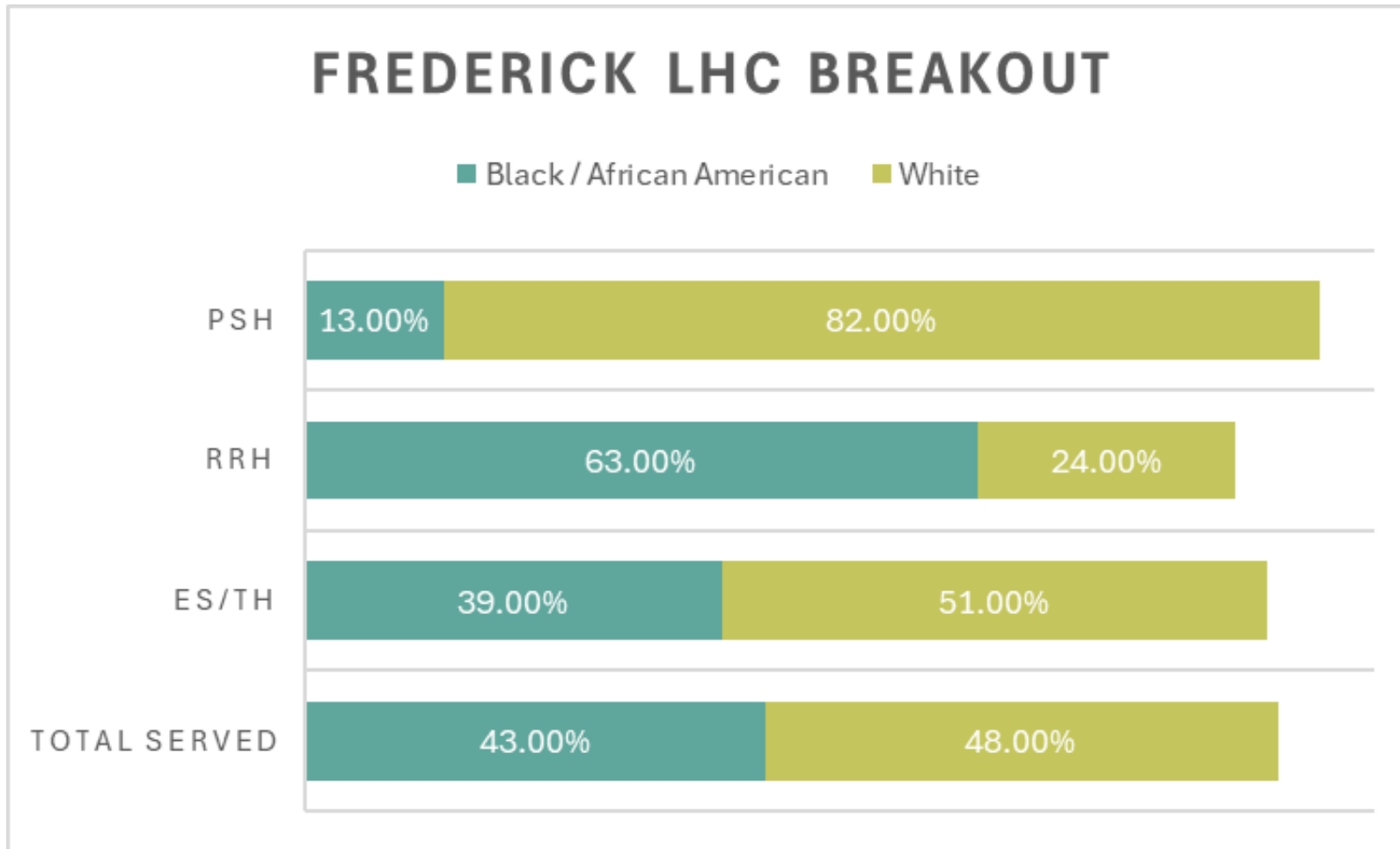

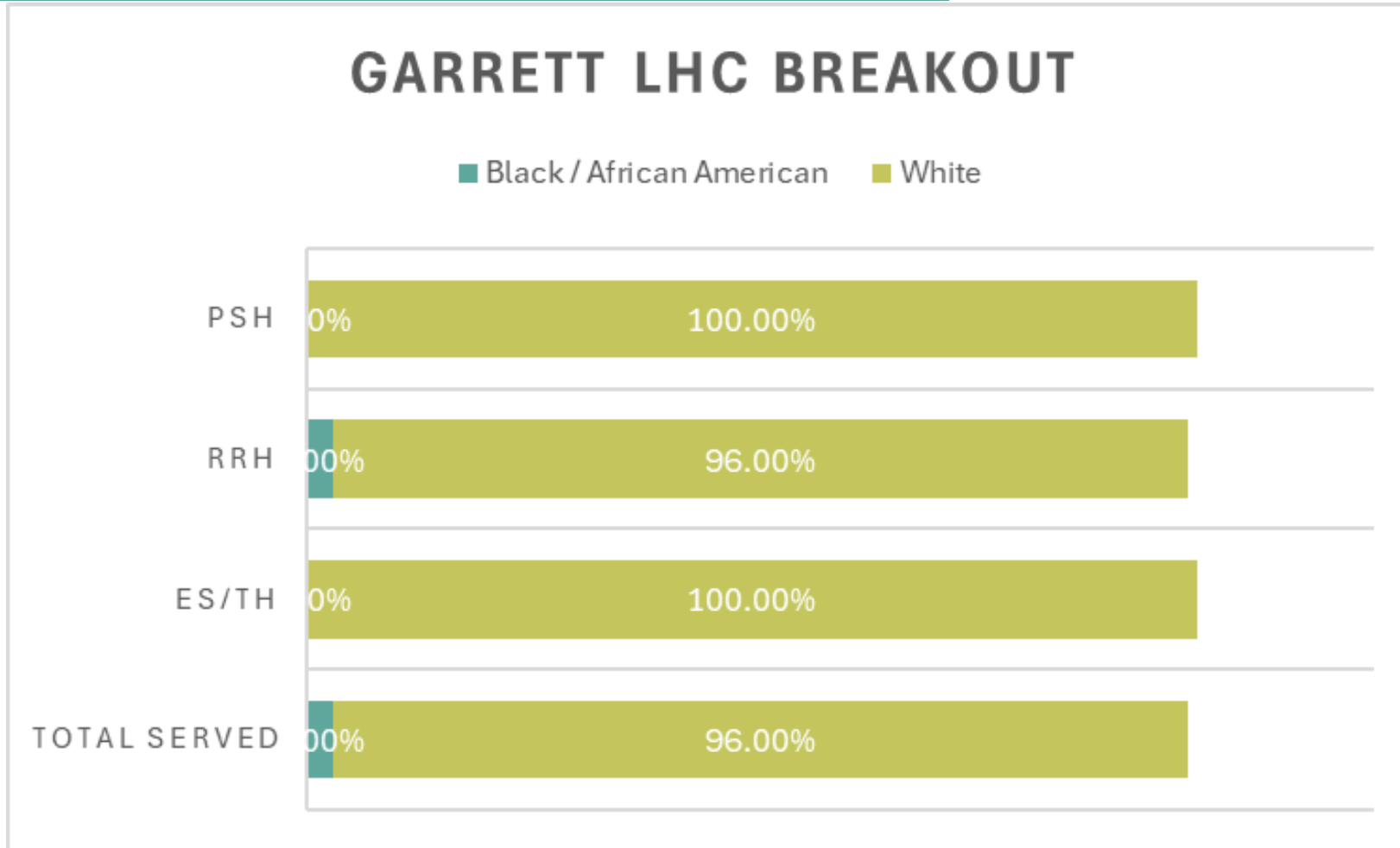

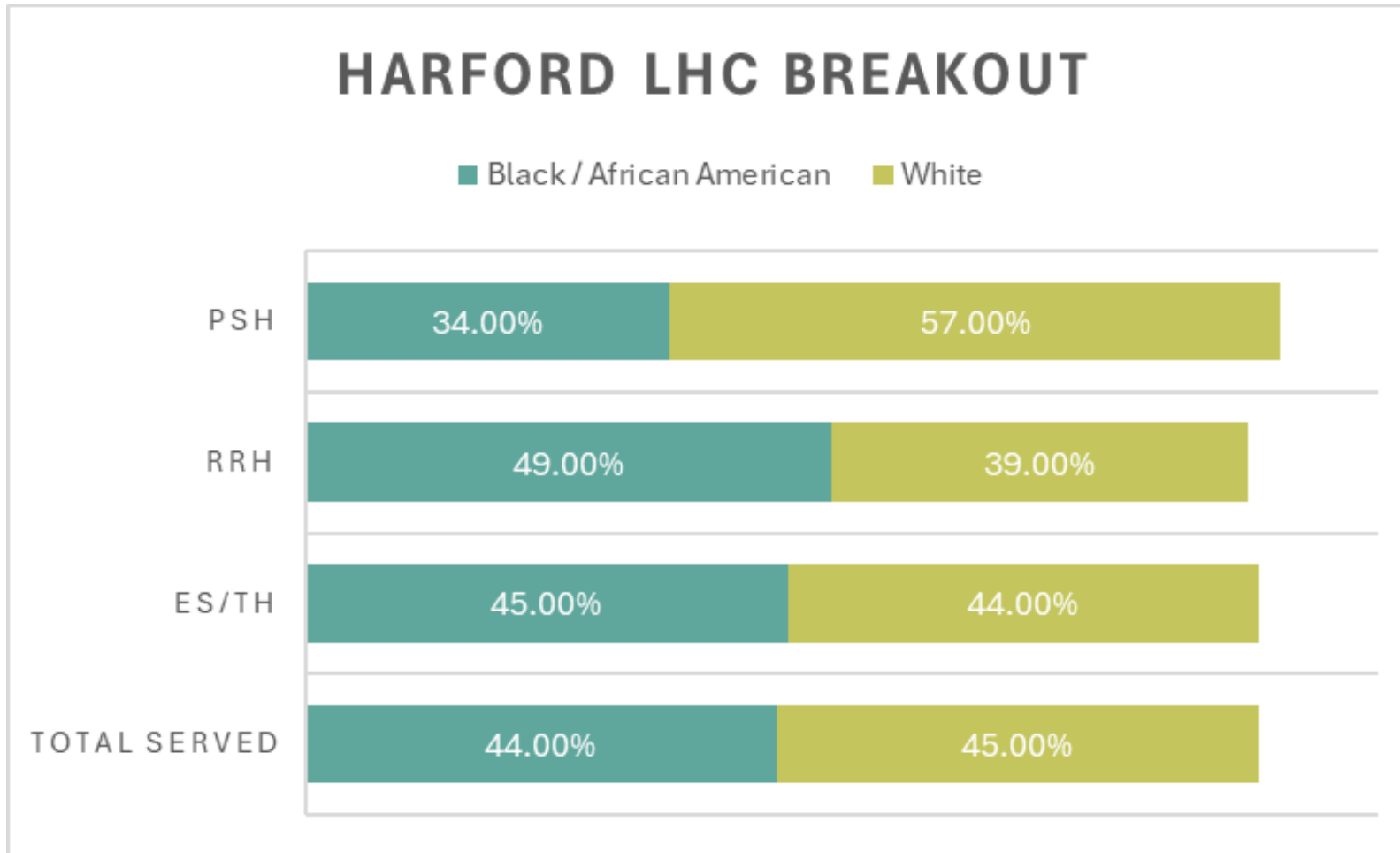

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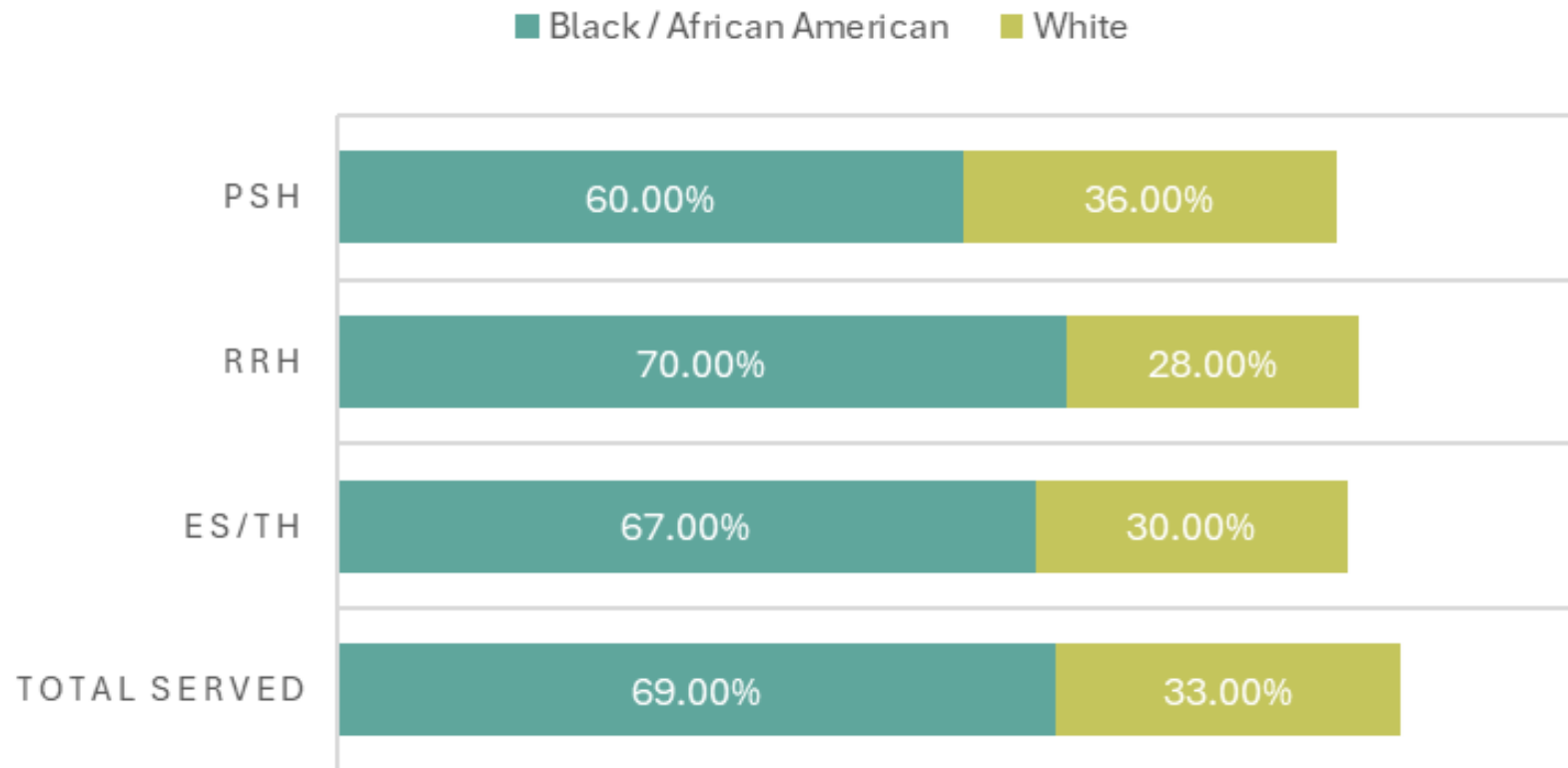

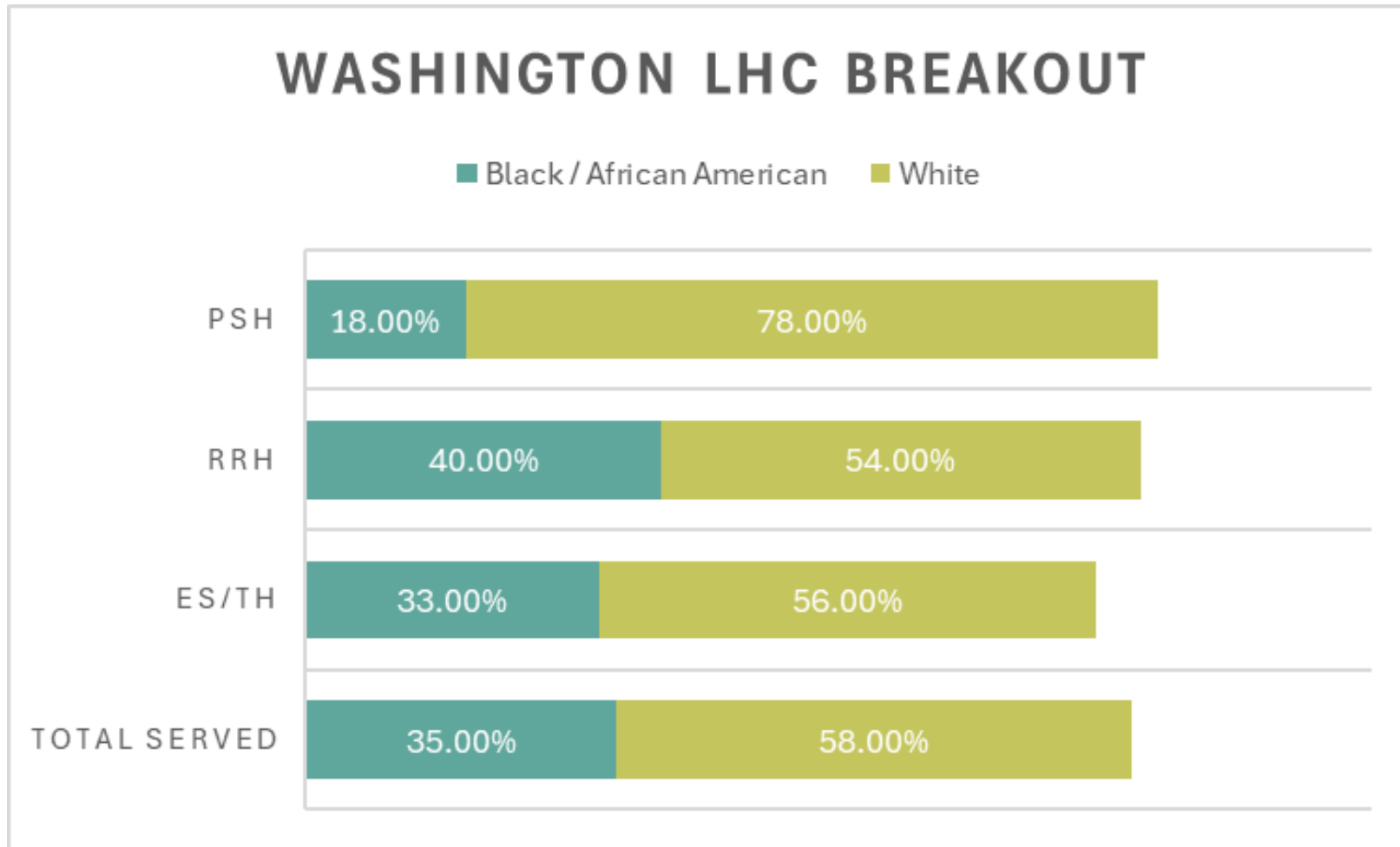

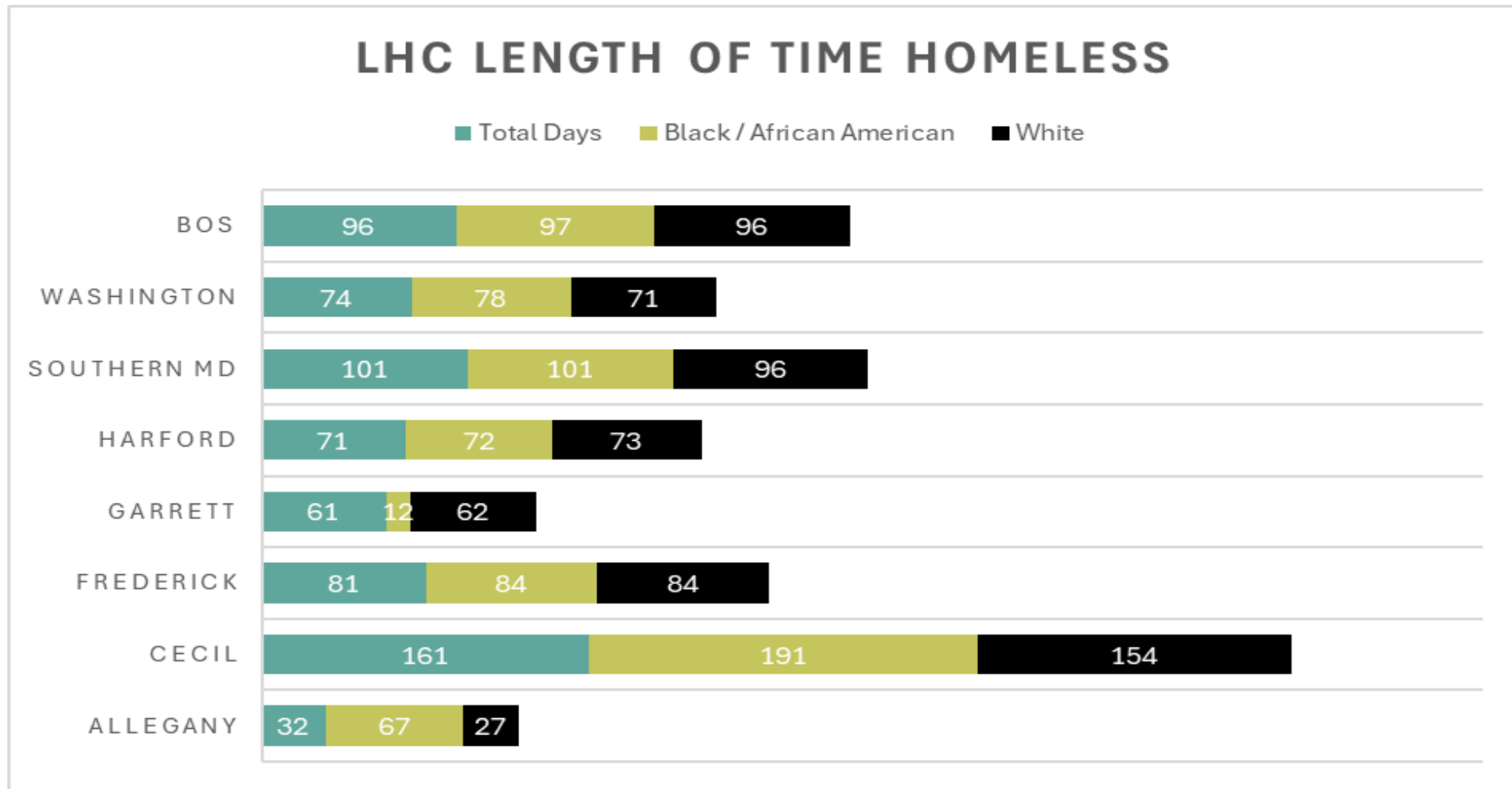
SOUTHERN MD LHC BREAKOUT



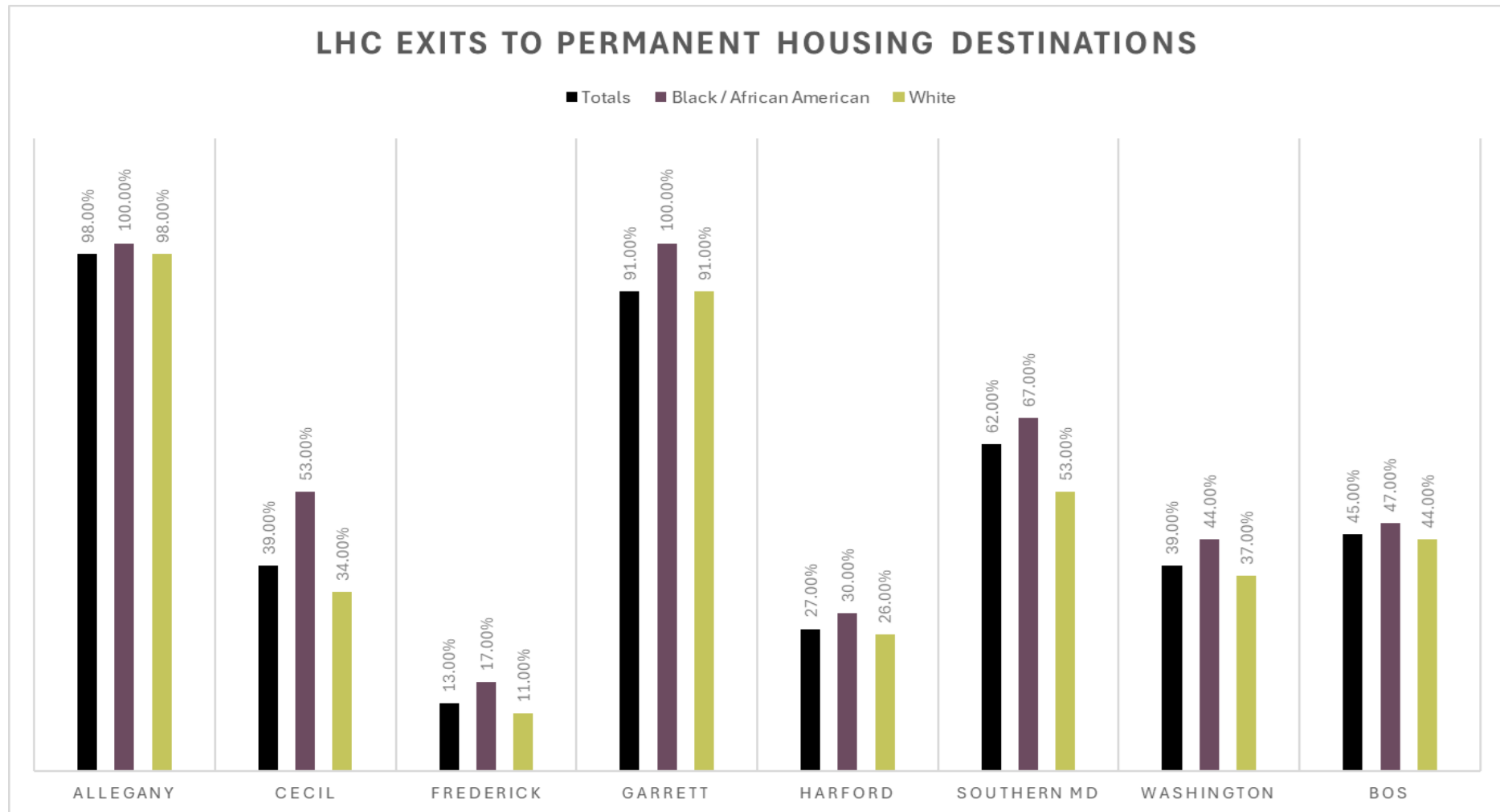

LHC: Length of Time Homeless

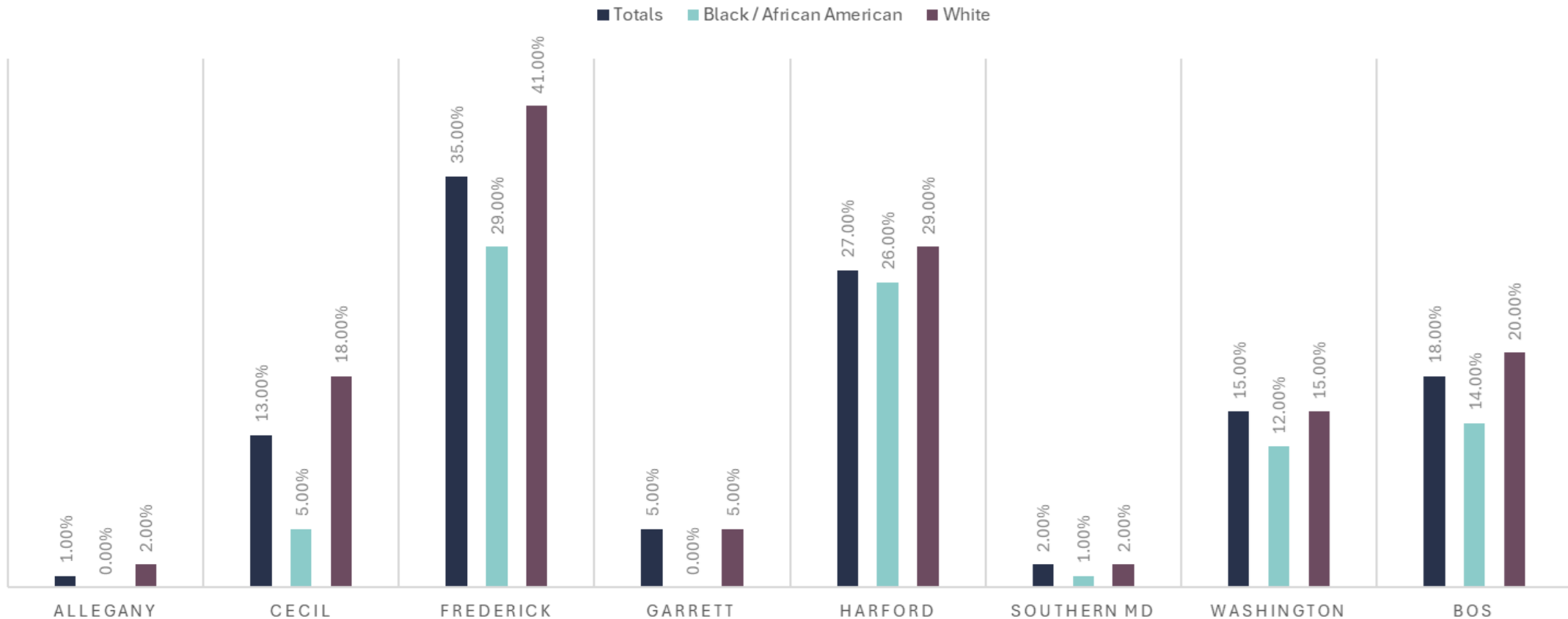


LHC: Exits to Permanent Housing

SFY2026 Annual Legislative Prep Calendar

May - June

- Idea generations process
 - Send ideas, needs, gaps in state policy or budget
 - DHCD solicits informal input from advocates and community partners on hot button issues

July - September

- DHCD vets and finalizes an internal legislative wishlist/plan for submission to Governor's Office

October - December

- Governor's Office reviews/approves legislative agenda
- Decisions made on which bills will be led by Governor's Office, DHCD, or via Private Sponsor
- DHCD starts coordinating with advocates and community partners on talking points, lining up testimony for bill hearings, and bill schedules
